The comprehensive roadmap created in the field of higher education will provide a new direction, and German universities have been invited to open their campuses in India. New Delhi: The Indian Parliament is hosting the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth (CSPOC) in New Delhi from January 14-16. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the conference on January 15 at 10:30 AM in the historic Central Hall of the Parliament House complex, Constitution House, in New Delhi. The Prime Minister had also inaugurated the 9th G20 Parliamentary Speakers' (P20) Summit. The P20 inter-parliamentary conference was hosted by the Indian Parliament in October 2023. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla is the Chairman of this conference. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla informed in a press conference on Monday that India is hosting the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth after 16 years. On January 14, a meeting of the Executive Council of 15 countries will be held.

ISRO Mission Suffers Major Setback: Rocket Fails to Place Satellite in Orbit

A disappointing development has emerged following the launch of the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) reliable PSLV-C62 rocket on Monday. Despite a successful launch, the rocket failed to place the satellites it was carrying into their designated orbits. ISRO officially confirmed the failure, stating that the vehicle lost control of its orientation and position during the third stage. This is the second consecutive instance of such a serious technical problem occurring in the third stage of the PSLV. Addressing scientists and the nation from the Mission Control Center, ISRO Chairman Dr.



V. Narayanan stated that the first three stages of the rocket performed perfectly normally. However, an unknown technical anomaly occurred thereafter, causing the flight to deviate from its planned trajectory and preventing the successful completion of the mission. He clarified that scientists are currently conducting a thorough analysis of the data received and a detailed report on the exact causes of the failure will be shared soon.

Death Toll Reaches 22: The number of deaths in Bhagirathpura continues to rise

Indore: The number of deaths caused by contaminated water supplied by the Indore Municipal Corporation in Bhagirathpura continues to rise. After 21 deaths due to the contaminated water supplied by the municipal corporation, the 22nd death occurred yesterday when Kamlabai, 59 years old, a resident of Nayapura Jeevan Ki Fail, Bhagirathpura, died at MY Hospital. The day before, Sunita Verma, wife of Satish, 49 years old, a resident of Farshi Wali Gali in Bhagirathpura, also died after consuming the water supplied by the Indore Municipal Corporation. Sunita was admitted to MYH on January 7th. With her death, the number of deaths due to contaminated water in Bhagirathpura reached 21, and now, after Kamlabai's death, the number has risen to 22.

Iranian Foreign Minister's visit to India canceled due to escalating protests and threat of attack in Iran

Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi's visit to India has been canceled. The visit was scheduled for January 15-16. The decision was made due to escalating protests in Iran and the threat of external intervention. Such a situation could trigger a major conflict in the region. Iran has warned that if the US attacks



Iran, it will retaliate against Israel and US military bases. This statement comes at a time when US President Trump has said that he is considering several options to support the ongoing protests in Iran. According to media reports, India is monitoring the situation. If the situation deteriorates and a conflict breaks out, plans have also been prepared to evacuate Indian citizens.

Man-Portable Anti-Tank Guided Missile Accurately Hits Target in Flight Test

The third-generation fire-and-forget man-portable anti-tank guided missile (MPATGM), with its superior offensive capabilities, has once again proven its effectiveness in a flight test. During the test, the performance of the missile and warhead was found to be as per the standards. The target of the test was a dummy tank, which the missile successfully destroyed. This test has paved the way for the Army to acquire the third-generation indigenous man-portable anti-tank guided missile. The Defence Research and



Development Laboratory (DRDL) in Hyderabad, a DRDO laboratory, successfully conducted the flight test against a moving target at the KK Range in Ahmednagar, Maharashtra. The indigenously developed MPATGM incorporates state-of-the-art indigenous technologies such as an Imaging Infrared (IIR) homing seeker, an all-electric control actuation system, a fire control system, a tandem warhead, a propulsion

system, and a high-performance sighting system. These have been developed by DRDO's collaborating laboratories: Research Centre Imarat, Hyderabad; Terminal Ballistics Research Laboratory, Chandigarh; High Energy Materials Research Laboratory, Pune; and Instruments Research and Development Establishment, Dehradun. According to DRDO, the thermal target system was developed by the Defence Laboratory, Jodhpur, to simulate a target tank. The IIR seeker is capable of combat operations during both day and night.

Massive fire breaks out in Himachal market, two dead including a child, 8 missing

Solan: A massive fire broke out in the lower market of Arki in Solan district of Himachal Pradesh due to several cylinder blasts. So far, two people, including a child, have died, while 8 people are reported missing. Four of the missing are children. A seven-year-old child was rescued alive from the fire, but he died in the hospital. Relief and rescue operations are underway. According to the information, the fire broke out in the lower main market of Arki last night. The fire quickly spread and several shops were engulfed in flames one after another. Several cylinders also exploded amidst the fire, causing panic in the market. People immediately informed the administration and the fire department.

I will kick people from UP and Bihar out of Mumbai: Raj Thackeray

Mumbai: Maharashtra Navnirman Sena chief Raj Thackeray has once again threatened people from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. Thackeray said that people from UP and Bihar should understand that Hindi is not their language. I don't hate the language, but if you try to impose it, I will kick you out. He said, "They are coming to Maharashtra from all sides and taking your share. If the land and language are gone, you will be finished." The District Welfare Officer informed that interested candidates can apply online through the departmental website from January 10, 2026 to February 9, 2026. Online admit cards will be available from February 15, 2026 to

February 22, 2026. The entrance examination will be held on March 1, 2026 (Sunday), while the results will be published on March 13, 2026. Admission of selected students will take place from March 16, 2026 to March 23, 2026, and classes will commence from April 1, 2026. The District Welfare Officer stated that admission to classes 6 to 9 in the residential schools run by the department will be based on a written objective test. This test will be of 100 marks, with a total of 100 questions, each question carrying 1 mark. The question paper will include questions worth 20 marks



each from Hindi, English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Science. The duration of the examination is two hours. He further informed that there are 40 seats available in class 6, 6 seats in class 7, 4 seats in class

8, and 4 seats in class 9. As per departmental rules, the applicant's age must be within the prescribed limit as of April 1, 2026. The age limit for class 6 is 10 to 13 years, for class 7 it is 11 to 14 years, for class

8 it is 12 to 15 years, and for class 9 it is 13 to 16 years. Applications from candidates outside the age limit will not be accepted. At the time of online application, candidates will be required to upload their caste certificate, domicile certificate, income certificate (annual income less than three lakh rupees), Aadhaar card, passport-size photograph, and a certificate of date of birth and class issued on the letterhead of their current school principal. It is worth noting that the Other Backward Classes Girls Residential +2 High School in Banka district

East Singhbhum: To ensure the peaceful and orderly conduct of Makar Sankranti and Tusu festivals, the East Singhbhum district administration has decided to ban the entry of heavy vehicles into the urban area on January 14 and 15. A joint order has been issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Senior Superintendent of Police, and Traffic DSP to prevent any inconvenience to devotees and the general public during the festivals and to maintain smooth traffic flow. IIT Madras develops ramjet-assisted artillery shells, boosts gun range by 50 per cent

New Delhi, Agency: IIT Madras has achieved a breakthrough in defence technology by developing ramjet-assisted artillery shells that can extend the range of existing gun systems by nearly 50 per cent without compromising lethality. This innovation integrates a ramjet engine into standard 155 mm artillery ammunition, replacing the conventional base-bleed unit, and enables sustained propulsion after the shell exits the gun barrel. The technology has shown substantial range

improvements across multiple platforms, including Advanced Towed Artillery Gun System (ATAGS), extended range from 40 km to 70 km; Vajra K-9 gun, extended range from 36 km to 62 km; Dhanush artillery guns, extended range from 30 km to 55 km, said IIT Madras. The project, launched in 2020 in collaboration with the Indian Army, has undergone extensive gun and field trials, successfully validating clean gun exit, stable flight, and reliable ramjet ignition.



This innovation aligns with the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, demonstrating how upgrading existing systems can deliver cost-effective, survivable, and future-ready firepower for modern battlefields. The project was led by Prof PA Ramakrishna of IIT Madras, along with Lt Gen P R Shankar (retd), Prof HSN Murthy, Prof G Rajesh, Prof M Ramakrishna, Prof Murugaiyan, Lt Gen Hari Mohan Iyer (retd), Prof Lazar C and Dr Yogesh Kumar Velari.

I-PAC raids: ED makes big charge against Mamata in SC accuses CM of obstructing probe, destroying evidence

New Delhi, Agency: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday moved the Supreme Court seeking directions for the registration of an FIR against West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee, the DGP and the Kolkata police commissioner for "obstructing probe, tampering with and destroying evidence in a multi-state money laundering case against I-PAC". Asserting the requirement for an FIR, the anti-money laundering agency said "protectors of law became party to a serious cognizable offence" as they "intimidated and threatened ED officers and snatched files and electronic evidence containing incriminating material."



The central probe agency also said it had approached the Calcutta high court for the CBI probe into the incident but "the clout enjoyed by the CM and her supproters was used to create a ruckus in the courtroom forcing the judge to adjourn hearing". The ED on Saturday moved the apex court



alleging interference and obstruction by the Mamata Banerjee-led West Bengal government during search operations at the Kolkata headquarters of political consultancy firm Indian Political Action Committee(I-PAC) and the residence of its director Pratik Jain. Later, the state government filed a caveat seeking

to be heard before any adverse order is passed. The Bengal government's caveat was filed after the ED carried out searches on Thursday at I-PAC's office and Jain's residence as part of a money laundering probe linked to an alleged multi-crore rupee coal pilferage scam. A caveat allows a party to ensure that no order is issued without giving it an opportunity to present its case. The ED has alleged that chief minister Mamata Banerjee entered the raid locations and took away what it described as "key" evidence, including physical documents and electronic devices. Banerjee has rejected the allegations and accused the central agency of overreach.

J&K: Suspected Pakistan drones spotted along LoC, IB near Samba, Rajouri and Poonch districts; search operations launched

New Delhi, Agency: Security forces detected movement of suspected drones in multiple forward areas along the International Border and the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba, Rajouri and Poonch districts on Sunday evening, officials said. All the flying objects were seen coming from the Pakistan side and returned after hovering over Indian territory for a few minutes, they added. Following the sightings, security forces launched ground search operations in the affected areas. In the Nowshera sector along the LoC in Rajouri district, Army troops opened fire using medium and light machine guns after observing drone movement over Gania-Kalsian village around 6.35 pm, officials said. Another drone was spotted over Khabbar village in the Teryath area of Rajouri district at around the same time. The flying object, with a



blinking light, was seen coming from the direction of Dharmsal village in Kalakote and moving towards Bharakh, they said. In Samba district, a drone-like object with a blinking light was seen hovering for several minutes over Chak Babral village in the Ramgarh sector around 7.15 pm, officials said. A similar object was also noticed moving from the direction of Tain towards Topa in the Mankote sector along the LoC in Poonch district at around 6.25 pm, they added.

India offers 'limitless possibilities' for investors, says Modi

New Delhi, Agency: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said India is emerging as a beacon of stability and opportunity amid global uncertainty, attracting growing trust from investors across the world. Addressing the Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conference for the Kutch and Saurashtra region, the Prime Minister said India's political stability, policy consistency and an expanding neo-middle class with rising purchasing power make the country a land of "limitless possibilities". He said that the Vibrant Gujarat Regional Summit conveys a clear message to investors, adding that for investment in regions such as Saurashtra and Kutch, "this is the time, the right time". Stating that global institutions are increasingly bullish on India, Modi said the International Monetary Fund has described India as the engine



of global growth, while S&P has upgraded India's sovereign rating after eighteen years. He added that Fitch Ratings has also praised India's macro-economic stability and fiscal credibility. Recalling the early days of the Vibrant Gujarat initiative, the Prime Minister said the original objective was to showcase Gujarat's potential, attract investment and create opportunities that would benefit both India and global stakeholders.

After COVID, survivors faced a second battle — stigma at home, work and hospitals

New Delhi, Agency: For many Indians who recovered from COVID-19 during the first wave, the pandemic did not end with a negative test report. A nationwide study has found that fear and stigma followed survivors long after recovery, leading to social exclusion, job loss and psychological distress, while also discouraging people from seeking testing or disclosing illness. The multi-centric study, conducted by researchers from the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and collaborating institutes and published in Discover Public Health on December 31, 2025, shows how fear of contagion quickly turned into moral judgement. People who tested positive were often seen not just as a health risk, but as responsible for bringing the disease into neighbourhoods. In many cases, this stigma extended to entire families, informally labelled as "corona house-



holds" even after recovery. Dr Rajesh Sagar, Professor of Psychiatry, AIIMS, said stigma was a major issue in the early phase of the pandemic and directly affected testing and disclosure. "I was part of the DGHS committee that framed national guidelines, and stigma was specifically addressed in them. Public labelling of houses and colonies intensified fear and led many people to hide symptoms or avoid testing," he said.

The qualitative study covered 18 districts across seven states — Assam, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. Researchers interviewed 223 people between September 2020 and January 2021, including 87 COVID-19 survivors and 136 community members, during India's first wave. Recovered patients reported being avoided by neighbours, excluded from weddings and community events, or withdrawing from social life to escape judgement. Several said the rejection continued for months despite medical clearance. Containment measures often worsened stigma. Houses marked with stickers, barricaded lanes and repeated official visits turned a private illness into a public identity, legitimising gossip and prolonging social rejection beyond the isolation period.

Shah wants 'neutral' Sabarimala probe

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, Agency: Union home minister Amit Shah demanded Sunday Kerala CM Pinarayi Vijayan's resignation and warned of statewide BJP protests unless a "neutral probe" is ordered into an alleged gold heist linked to Sabarimala hill shrine. "It is time for CM Pinarayi Vijayan to go, as LDF could not safeguard Sabarimala and also could not bring development to the state," Shah said, addressing party workers at a felicitation function for BJP winners in local body

polls in Thiruvananthapuram. He said the FIR in the case was "designed to protect the real culprits" and questioned how justice could be ensured "when ministers are involved". The alleged gold heist linked to Sabarimala in Pathanamthitta district has triggered political accusations, with BJP claiming a cover-up and seeking a probe independent of Kerala police. Left Democratic Front (LDF) govt denies wrongdoing. According to the state-appointed SIT, gold

embedded in sacred structures was allegedly stripped, diverted and converted in 2015 through a planned operation involving temple officials, intermediaries and private jewellers. Setting the tone for BJP's campaign ahead of the 2026 Kerala assembly elections, Shah predicted a breakthrough. "The lotus will bloom in the state as BJP will assume office in 2026," he said. "Our aim is to develop Kerala, to protect the state from anti-nationals, and safeguard the cen-

turies-old devotion of the people." He accused both LDF and Congress-led opposition United Democratic Front (UDF) of "match-fixing" that led to stagnation. "Communist parties are wiped out from the entire world and Congress has been wiped out in India. The path to development of Kerala is with NDA under the leadership of Modi-ji," Shah said, linking Kerala's future to PM Narendra Modi's goal of a developed India by 2047.

Teen kills 34-year-old Bengaluru techie for refusing sexual advances

Bengaluru, Agency: Bengaluru police on Sunday said they have arrested an 18-year-old man on murder charges in connection with the death of a 34-year-old woman software engineer, who was initially suspected to have died in a fire accident, at her apartment in the eastern part of the city. The man is a native of Kodagu district. He allegedly murdered her for refusing sexual advances. The victim, who hailed from Dakshina Kannada, worked for a prominent tech company here. It was initially suspected that she died due to suffocation from smoke, after a fire broke at her two-bedroom flat, allegedly due to a short circuit, late

on January 3 night. The incident had happened at Subramanya Layout in the Ramamurthy Nagar police station limits. Her flatmate had gone to her hometown when the incident happened. Police, who investigated the case based on a complaint by a victim's friend, who expressed suspicion about the death, have arrested the suspect. According to police, the suspect, who lived with his mother next door, allegedly entered the victim's flat through a siding window at around 9 pm on January 3 and asked her to cooperate sexually, to which she resisted.

Is money deposited in banks safe?

Loan waivers have been announced periodically across the country. When the question arises about farmer loan waivers and debt restructuring for certain sectors, whether bank loans have been waived, this naturally raises concerns among the public. Will the money deposited in banks, especially in savings accounts and fixed deposits (FDs), remain safe? Banks take deposits from

the general public. They accept this money in the form of fixed deposits, savings accounts and current accounts. On the basis of this deposit, banks give various types of loans. They give home loans, personal loans, gold loans and loans to industries. Banks pay low interest on deposits and charge higher interest on loans. Banks operate with the income from this difference in interest. They return interest and principal to the

depositors on time. Public sector banks are nationalized banks. The general public trusts them. In the past few years, the government and banks have written off approximately 16 lakh crore rupees in corporate loans. Banks have also invested heavily in the stock market, providing the largest number of loans to the industrial sector. This has raised concerns among people about whether their money deposited in banks

will be safe if the stock market declines. When loans are waived for a specific category, it's often not a "complete waiver." In most cases, the government reimburses the banks from the public treasury. This amount, which the government provides to banks, doesn't directly impact bank deposits. Depositors' money remains safe. Therefore, there's usually no direct threat to the deposits of ordinary depositors.

If a bank is grappling with large amounts of bad loans (NPAs), and the government or the Reserve Bank does not intervene in time, the risk can increase. Banks also operate under the Companies Act and are subject to bankruptcy laws. To mitigate this risk, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) maintains strict oversight of banks. Furthermore, under the Deposit Insurance and Credit Corporation (DICGC), every

depositor is insured for up to ₹5 lakh per bank. Questions arise from time to time regarding the investments of insurance companies and banks. It's true that banks and insurance companies invest deposits in the stock market and other investment avenues. These investments are subject to strict regulations and risk management. Bank deposits are not invested directly in the stock market.

Fearing de-dollarisation: On the U.S., oil and the petrodollar

President Donald Trump's urgency to push the Russia Sanctions Bill through Congress, granting him the power to impose tariffs of up to 500% on nations buying oil from Moscow, is officially framed as a punitive measure to weaken Russia's war economy. Yet, this legislative push comes just after the capture of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro on January 3. Throughout his press briefings thereafter, Mr. Trump emphasised Venezuela's vast oil reserves as America's underlying strategic interest. This twin focus on Russian sanctions and Venezuelan oil assets suggests that both measures are less about geopolitical 'penalisation' and more about protecting the petrodollar's dominance at a time when its hegemony is eroding. For decades, oil has been priced and largely settled in U.S. dollars. That system underpinned the dollar's centrality in global finance for much of the late 20th century. But since the sanctions on Russia following its 2014 annexation of Crimea, and, more vigorously, after the Ukraine invasion in 2022, major consumers such as China and India have deepened trading arrangements that circumvent the dollar. India, for instance, imported substantial volumes of Russian crude since 2022, accounting for more than 20% of Russia's war-period crude exports. China's purchases were even larger, reflecting its strategy to secure energy at a discount and experiment with non-dollar settlement mechanisms.

The rise of youth power through Vedanta and the timeless philosophy of Swami Vivekananda

Trump's tariffs challenge global trade pacts

Weakening the global trade treaty is weakening the global economy, and all countries will have to pay the price for this. More than 70 countries are currently witnessing protests against recession, unemployment, and inflation. Those currently in power are facing challenges. 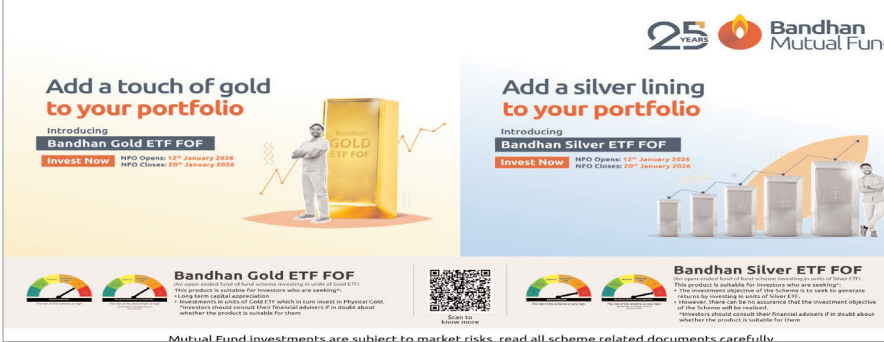

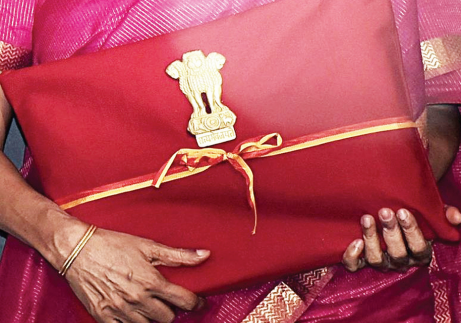
He further added, "Although central government schemes such as CGTMSE, MUDRA and PMEGP are intended to improve access to credit, their effective-

Shanaka compiled a 15-ball 52-run partnership with Janith Liyanage (22 off eight balls).

Irfan Pathan dissects Virat Kohli's consistency after legendary batter's match-winning 93 against New Zealand



New Delhi ,Agency: Former Indian cricketer Irfan Pathan dissected the reason behind Virat Kohli's consistency in ODIs after the legendary Indian batter's match-winning 93-run knock against New Zealand at Vadodara on Sunday in the first ODI of the three-match series against New Zealand. Pathan noted Kohli's head position and his body strength, saying they help the batter on the crease. Kohli scored 93 off 91 balls, helping India clinch the match by four wickets while chasing New Zealand's 301-run target at the BCA Stadium in Kotambi, Vadodara. Notably, this marked Kohli's seventh consecutive fifty-plus score in the 50-over cricket since the third match of the ODI series in Australia in October 2025. Of the seven fifty-plus scores, Kohli has three centuries (two in ODIs and one in the Vijay Hazare Trophy). His last seven scores read: 93, 77, 131, 65*, 102, 135, and 74*.

Speaking on his YouTube channel, Irfan Pathan offered high praise to Kohli, calling

him "Virat consistent Kohli". Pathan lauded the 37-year-old batter's strong technique, fitness and fearless approach--especially his ability to step out of the crease and adapt his innings effectively. Pathan also noted that while Kohli hit several boundaries in the early stages of his innings against New Zealand, he changed his approach thereafter. Pathan also called for there to be more five-match ODI series and even triangular ODI series so that the cricket world can see more of Kohli, since he is exclusively an ODI player now. "The way Virat Kohli is batting, we can call him 'Virat consistent Kohli'. In the last seven innings, he has scored three centuries and four half-centuries. He missed out on a hundred by a whisker in the first ODI and has now amassed 28000 runs in international cricket. He is now only the second after Sachin Tendulkar. Kohli deserves praise for the way he approaches his innings, especially for stepping out regularly at 37. When a batter steps out regularly, many things can go wrong. But Kohli's head position is strong, and it shows his technique is strong. Your core needs to be strong, so do your calves and glutes. Only then, a batter step out and hit those big shots. He had struck six boundaries in his first 20 balls and changed his approach afterwards," Pathan said on his YouTube channel. "He played aggressively at the start, but scored only one boundary in the next 50 deliveries when he was set. It is amazing to see his approach and how he keeps getting better. I feel there should be either a five-match series or a triangular series so we can see Kohli score more international runs. Not only was I expecting him to score a ton, but also finish the game. He often does that, but couldn't today," Pathan said further. With the fifty, Virat Kohli also surpassed Kumar Sangakkara's tally of 28,016 runs to become the second-highest run-getter across all formats in international cricket, only behind Sachin Tendulkar. Now in 557 matches, Kohli has 28,068 runs to his name at an average of 52.66, with 84 centuries in 146 centuries.

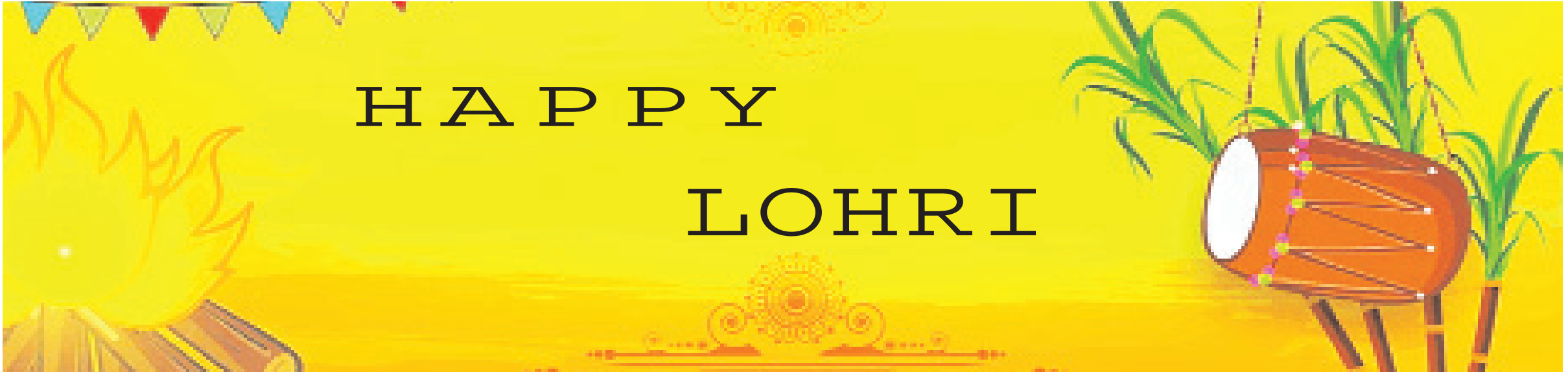
Afghanistan's Mohammad Nabi shares 53-run stand with son Hassan Eisakhil in BPL clash
