

Cabinet approves extension of Atal Pension Yojana till 2031

Cabinet approves modern corridor project

New Delhi: The BJP government in Delhi is set to complete one year in office next month. In this context, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta's government appears to be actively working to fulfill its promises. On Tuesday, in a cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, the Finance Expenditure Committee approved a crucial infrastructure project for South Delhi. Under the project, a 6-lane integrated elevated road and two underpasses will be constructed on MB Road, from Saket G-Block to Pul Pratap. This will provide much-needed relief to the people of South Delhi from the long-standing problem of traffic congestion.

The government on Wednesday decided to extend the Atal Pension Yojana (APY) till the financial year 2030-31 and approved increased government support for its promotion, developmental activities, and gap financing. This decision, taken at a Union Cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday, will ensure regular income security in old age for crores of workers in the unorganized sector. According to the Cabinet decision, the scheme will be continued till 2030-31. Under this, the government will provide support for promotional and developmental activities such as public awareness and capacity building to increase the reach of the scheme to workers in the unorganized sector. Necessary gap financing will also be provided to ensure the financial stability of

This decision will strengthen

the scheme. This extension of the scheme will provide financial security in old age to low-income groups and workers in the unorganized sector. This will promote financial inclusion and help move the country towards a pension-based society.

Accurate Voter Lists Crucial for Democracy: CEC

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Gyanesh Kumar said on Wednesday that accurate and updated voter lists are essential for strengthening democracy. He made these remarks at the inaugural session of the International Conference of Electoral Bodies of Democratic Countries held at Bharat Mandapam on Wednesday. The Election Commission launched the International Conference on Democracy and Election Management (ICDEM-2026). Addressing the inaugural session, the CEC shared the success of India's electoral system. He stated that during the recently held assembly elections in Bihar, the voter list of approximately 75 million voters was extensively updated, against which not a single appeal was filed. Furthermore,



peaceful polling took place at nearly one lakh polling stations, and no re-polling was required anywhere. The conference was attended by about one thousand participants, including representatives from 42 election management bodies, ambassadors and high commissioners from 27 countries, experts from more than 70 national institutions, senior officials of the Election Commission of India, and 36 Chief Electoral Officers from across the country.

Broken seats, dirty and foul-smelling toilets, and poor quality food and drinks



New Delhi: The Delhi District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission has ordered Air India to pay a compensation of 1.5 lakh to a passenger and his daughter. This decision was made regarding poor services during a long international flight. Shailendra Bhatnagar and his daughter traveled on an Air India Delhi-New York-Delhi flight in September 2023. They had booked economy class tickets through MakeMyTrip. The passengers complained that they faced several problems during the flight. The aircraft seats were broken and uncomfortable. The in-flight entertainment system was not working. The seat buttons and call buttons were also faulty. In addition, the toilets were dirty and smelled foul. The passengers also stated that the quality of food and drinks was very poor. According to media reports, the biggest problem was that the cabin crew did not provide any proper assistance despite repeated complaints.

Sunita Williams, who holds the record for traveling to space 9 times and spending 608 days in space, retires



New Delhi: Sunita Williams, the renowned Indian-origin astronaut who left an indelible mark on the world of space science, has bid farewell to the American space agency NASA. NASA has officially announced that Williams' retirement, after serving the agency for 27 years, became effective on December 27 of last year. This announcement comes at a time when Sunita Williams is currently on a visit to India, reliving memories of her ancestral homeland. Selected by NASA in 1998, Williams participated in three significant space missions during her career and spent a total of 608 days in space. She holds the record for the most spacewalks by a woman, with nine spacewalks totaling 62 hours and 6 minutes. This is the most for any female astronaut and the fourth highest in NASA's history.

Legal action will be taken if the notice is not withdrawn: Avimukteswaranand

Prayagraj: The controversy has deepened after the Prayagraj Mela Authority issued a notice to Swami Avimukteswaranand Saraswati. Politics has also entered the fray, and Swami Avimukteswaranand has now sent an eight-page reply to the authority through his Supreme Court lawyer. In his reply, Swami Avimukteswaranand completely rejected the allegations of the Mela Authority and stated that he

is the Shankaracharya. The reply states that the late Shankaracharya Swami Swaroopanand Saraswati had appointed him as his successor during his lifetime. It is mentioned that

Shankaracharya Swami Swaroopanand Saraswati passed away on September 11, 2022, and on September 12, 2022, Swami Avimukteswaranand was formally consecrated according to Vedic rituals. He was installed as the Shankaracharya in a public ceremony.

BJP demands action against Udhayanidhi after High Court's decision in Amit Malviya case

New Delhi: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has targeted the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) after the Madras High Court quashed the FIR registered against Amit Malviya, the party's IT cell chief, for allegedly distorting the remarks of Tamil Nadu Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin. The party has also demanded that Udhayanidhi be removed from his post and that a case be registered against him. BJP national spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla said at a press conference at the party headquarters on Wednesday that the High Court's decision exposes the DMK's "anti-Hindu and anti-constitutional mindset." He said the FIR was filed out of vendetta, with the sole purpose of harassing and punishing Amit Malviya for speaking the truth. Poonawalla said, "Satyameva Jayate."

AI is now a necessity for the present and the future of telecommunications: TRAI

At a conference organized by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) and the Software Technology Parks of India (STPI) on Wednesday, it was stated that artificial intelligence (AI) is improving customer experience and that a responsible AI framework is needed to maintain transparency and consumer trust. According to the Ministry of Communications, TRAI Chairman Anil Kumar Lahoti, members Ritu Ranjan Mittal and Dr. MP Tangirala, Secretary Atul Kumar Chaudhary, STPI Director General Arvind Kumar, and IIT Gandhinagar Director Prof. Rajat Moona were present at the event. STPI Director General Arvind Kumar said that networks were previously referred to simply as pipes, but now, due to artificial intelligence, they have become "intelligent pipes." TRAI Secretary Atul Kumar Chaudhary said that AI will improve the quality of service and that appropriate rules

and regulations are necessary for this. TRAI Chairman Anil Kumar Lahoti said that artificial intelligence is not a thing of the future but has already become the foundation of telecommunications. From network automation to preventing spam calls, AI is already transforming services. Its use should be transparent, responsible, and fair to maintain consumer trust. There was a consensus at the event that given the rapid adoption of artificial intelligence in the telecommunications sector, focus must be placed on secure deployment, indigenous research, and capacity building.

BJP considering bringing new party president Nitin Naveen to Rajya Sabha

BJP's new national president, Nitin Naveen, will soon enter the Rajya Sabha. According to party sources, several Rajya Sabha seats will become vacant this year, and the party is considering bringing him into the Upper House of Parliament. However, he will not be included in the Union Cabinet for now, as the party is following the principle of one person, one post. The 45-year-old Nitin Naveen is a five-time MLA from Bihar. He has become the youngest national president of the

Godda: A review meeting on cases related to Acquittal Appeals was held today in the auditorium of the Collectorate, chaired by District Magistrate-cum-Deputy Commissioner, Godda, Ms. Anjali Yadav, IAS, and Superintendent of Police, Godda, Mr. Mukesh Kumar. During the meeting, the Deputy Commissioner conducted a detailed review of the acquittal orders passed in various courts in the district. She instructed that in all cases where there is a strong possibility of appeal based on evidence, facts, and legal provisions, it should be ensured that an Acquittal Appeal is filed in the competent court within the stipulated time frame. The Deputy Commissioner directed



the officers associated with the prosecution to review all acquittal cases systematically and identify cases with strong grounds for appeal. In appealable cases, they were instructed to thoroughly examine the case diary, evidence, witness statements, and court observations and take prompt action. They were also instructed

to work in coordination to avoid any unnecessary delay in filing appeals. Priority should be given to serious crimes, cases related to women/children, and matters of public interest. The Deputy Commissioner clarified that maintaining public trust in the judicial process is the primary responsibility of the administration; therefore, legal, transparent, and prompt action should be taken in matters related to Acquittal Appeals. At the end of the meeting, the concerned officers were instructed to provide progress reports within the stipulated time frame. The District Prosecution Officer, Assistant Public Prosecutor, senior officers from the concerned departments, and officers from the legal branch were present at the meeting.

Brief News**Weather fluctuations continue, Chaibasa records temperature six degrees above normal**


Ranchi: Weather fluctuations continue in various districts of the state. Some districts are experiencing cloudy conditions, while others are feeling the heat. This is why the maximum temperature in Chaibasa was recorded six degrees (31.2) above normal. Similarly, the temperature in Ranchi was 2.4 degrees above normal, Jamshedpur 30.5, Daltonganj 3.6 degrees above normal, and Bokaro 2.7 degrees above normal. Temperature fluctuations are likely to continue in the coming days across the state, including the capital Ranchi. The Meteorological Department stated on Wednesday that a low-pressure area persists over northwestern Uttar Pradesh and adjoining areas. Additionally, a new Western Disturbance is likely to affect the northwestern parts of the country from January 26th. Its impact will be seen in various states, including Jharkhand. Meanwhile, on Wednesday, the sky remained partly cloudy in Ranchi and surrounding areas from morning. This resulted in alternating feelings of warmth and coolness. However, the weather cleared up in the afternoon. In the last 24 hours, the highest temperature was recorded in Chaibasa at 31.2 degrees Celsius and the lowest in Gumla at 8.4 degrees Celsius. On Wednesday, the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded were: Ranchi 26.6 and 12.9 degrees, Jamshedpur 30.5 and 13.2 degrees, Daltonganj 29.2 and 9.7 degrees, Bokaro 28.2 and 12.1 degrees, Chaibasa 31.2 and 12.6 degrees, Khunti 27.7 and 10.3 degrees, Lohardaga 27.7 and 10.8 degrees, Latchar 22.7 and 12.2 degrees, and Seraikela 31.2 and 12 degrees Celsius.

**Proposed Zayka Food Fest at DSPMU opposed, student organizations submit memorandum to Registrar**

Ranchi: A joint delegation of the Adivasi Students' Association (ASA), AJSU Students' Union, and the National Students' Union of India (NSUI) met with the Registrar of Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee University (DSPMU), Ranchi, on Wednesday and submitted a memorandum protesting the proposed Zayka Food Fest. ASA President Vivek Tirkey stated that the food fest, being organized by the university's MBA and BBA departments, is completely inappropriate given the current academic and career-related challenges faced by students and should be canceled immediately. He added that the position of Placement Officer at the university has been vacant for the past three months, adversely affecting students' employment and career opportunities. Despite this, the university administration has not taken any concrete steps in this regard. The AJSU Students' Union specifically raised the issue of over 150 to 200 students in the BBA department having year-back issues under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for the 2023-27 session. The organization termed this a serious academic crisis for the university and a crucial issue concerning the students' future. The ASA, NSUI, and AJSU Students' Union jointly stated that instead of events like food festivals, the university should organize job fairs, placement drives, career counseling, and skill development programs to provide real benefits to the students. The organizations also questioned the university administration's indifference regarding the AICTE accreditation of the MBA and BBA courses. The student organizations warned that if the university administration does not seriously consider their demands, they will be forced to launch a phased agitation. Present during the meeting were ASA President Vivek Tirkey, Dinesh Oraon, Ajit Mahto, Ashu Mahto, University Convener Ravi Roshan, Prashant Mahto, Nitesh Sharma, Bitti Verma, Raj, NSUI Ranchi Metropolitan President Satish Kesari, General Secretary Hrithik Kumar, Vice President Sudhanush Raj, and several other office bearers and students from the three student organizations.

Along with this, the wages, allowances, and other outstanding payments of the Anganwadi workers and helpers have also been pending for a long time. JP Pandey said that sustainable development of any state is impossible without strong human resources.

This bill will be introduced as a money bill. Nitin Nabin takes charge as BJP president

What's at stake for PM Modi's 'boss' in party

New Delhi, Agency: Nitin Nabin, who formally took charge as the national president of the Bharatiya Janata Party today, has his task cut out for him. His immediate challenge are the assembly elections in Assam, West Bengal, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.

The BJP has a lot at stake in this round of elections as it defends its government in Assam and Puducherry and goes all-out to wrest power from Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress in West Bengal. In Tamil Nadu and Kerala, the BJP is trying hard to expand its base.

2027 will be another busy year electorally for the BJP president as seven states, including Uttar Pradesh, will



vote to elect new assemblies. The other six are: Gujarat, Goa, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal and Manipur.

Chhattisgarh, a state which played a key role in giving prominence to Nitin Nabin, will vote in 2028 along with eight other states - Madhya

Pradesh, Rajasthan, Telangana, Karnataka, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura and Meghalaya. Nitin Nabin was the party in charge in Chhattisgarh in the 2022 assembly elections and the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

And finally, 2029 will see

the BJP under Nitin Nabin go all out for a record fourth consecutive victory in the general elections.

The five-time Bihar MLA, who is widely recognised for his organisational acumen and administrative experience, will play a key role in anchoring the BJP's election efforts.

More than the opposition parties, his toughest competition will come from his predecessors in the party who have led the party to great electoral successes since 2014.

With coalitions becoming an integral part of today's politics, Nitin Nabin will also have to play an important role in working with the party's regional allies in different states.

Monkeypox strain links Kerala cases to foreign travel: Study

Pune, Agency: A first-of-its-kind genetic study of a newer and more stubborn Mpox variant detected in Kerala has linked those cases to international travel and reported signs of continued human-to-human transmission.



The study of Mpox Clade Ib, which has been driving outbreaks in parts of Africa and has since showed up in several countries outside the continent, showed that it is prone to spreading faster and wider than older variants of the virus, necessitating enhanced surveillance. The study, led by researchers from Pune's ICMR-National Institute of Virology and teams from Viral Research and Diagnostic Laboratories across India, focused on 10 lab-confirmed cases of Mpox Clade Ib in Kerala between Sept 2024 and March 2025. The findings, published in the journal Virology, indicate active viral evolution with implications for disease surveillance and public health preparedness. "The study confirmed the Mpox virus is indeed mutating, as we found a distinctive mutation pattern that signals sustained human-to-human transmission," a researcher said. Scientists found the mutation pattern stronger in Clade Ib than in older forms of the virus, suggesting it continues to adapt while circulating.

No hassle over 'logical discrepancies'

CM Mamata backs new SC directives on SIR; urges officials to ease voter hearings

New Delhi, Agency: West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday personally addressed concerns over the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, urging district magistrates to ensure that voters face no inconvenience over "logical discrepancies."

Banerjee made the remarks during an unexpected meeting with district magistrates at the state secretariat, Nabanna, which was chaired by chief secretary Nandini Chakraborty.

"The CM made it clear that all hearings related to SIR must be conducted strictly in accordance with the apex court's directives. She specifically instructed officials to ensure that people are not put to inconvenience under the pretext of logical discrepancies," a senior official said.

On the difficulties faced by voters during SIR hearings, the CM called for



a humanitarian approach. "She underlined that documents declared valid by the Supreme Court must be accepted during hearings without exception. District magistrates were also instructed to ensure that receipts are issued after documents are submitted," the official added.

Banerjee also stressed that alternative arrangements should be made for voters unable to attend hearings on the designated dates. She said that while the Election Commission's work must continue, the state's development programmes should not be disrupted "under any circumstance."

The Supreme Court had on Monday directed the Election Commission to display the names of those on the 'logical discrepancies' list at gram panchayat bhavans and block offices, where documents and objections can also be submitted. The apex court also granted electors an additional 10 days to submit documents to confirm their inclusion in the state electoral roll. The latest directions have brought relief to several voters in Kolkata who were summoned for hearings after discrepancies were found in their voter records.



According to the Ministry of Railways, the first commercial run of the Vande Bharat Sleeper between Kamakhya and Howrah saw all tickets

sell out within hours of bookings opening.

The train's launch followed the flagging off of India's first Vande Bharat Sleeper by Prime Minister Narendra Modi from Malda town in West Bengal on January 17. The service aims to make long-distance overnight travel faster and more comfortable while improving connectivity between eastern India and the Northeast.

The semi-high-speed, fully air-conditioned train will operate six days a week, except Wednesdays from Kamakhya and Thursdays from Howrah. It will complete the Howrah-Kamakhya journey in about 14 hours, making it the fastest train on the route. Key stops include Malda Town, New Jalpaiguri, New Cooch Behar, and New Alipurduar.

The service is expected to significantly benefit passengers travelling between West Bengal and Assam, particularly those undertaking overnight journeys.

J&K: IED detected on Srinagar-Baramulla highway; destroyed



Srinagar, Agency: Days ahead of Republic Day, security forces Tuesday detected an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) on Srinagar-Baramulla national highway, which was later defused.

A senior Sashastra Seema Bal official said SSB personnel responsible for road opening party duties in Tapper Pattan area detected the explosive during a routine anti-sabotage check. The area was immediately cordoned off, and traffic on the highway was halted. The object was examined using a deep-search metal detector, which confirmed that it was an IED.

The official said a bomb disposal squad was called in and the device was destroyed in a controlled explo-

sion. Traffic was later restored on the highway, which connects the north Kashmir districts of Baramulla and Kupwara with Srinagar.

Meanwhile, J&K DGP Nalin Prabhat Tuesday chaired a security review meeting in north Kashmir's Ganderbal district to assess the prevailing security scenario and operational preparedness. The meeting was attended by senior police officials.

"During the meeting, the DGP took a detailed review of the law and order management, counter-terrorism preparedness, crime control measures, and security arrangements for Republic Day 2026," a police spokesperson added.

Government advises kin of Indian officials in Bangladesh to return

New Delhi, Agency: Amidst the threat of violence against Indian establishments in Bangladesh, the Indian govt has advised the families of Indian diplomats and officials in the country to return to India. "Given the security situation, as a precautionary measure, we have advised the dependents of mission and post officials to return to India. The mission and all posts in Bangladesh continue to remain open and operational," said an official source, adding that the Indian mission in the country continues to work at full strength. According to sources, the decision was taken in the light of recent anti-India protests that threatened to get out of hand. "It's for the time being and will be reviewed later," said an official on condition of anonymity. In India's neighbourhood, Afghanistan remains the only non-family posting for Indian officials. While diplomats in Pakistan are allowed to take their families along, they generally avoid it because the govt had advised them after the Peshawar school attack to not send their children to local schools.



The mail did not arrive

The postal system holds as important a place in Indian democracy as the railways. If the mail stops, society's heartbeat stops; if a train stops, it causes havoc. Like many other services, both of these systems are essentially for public welfare, and therefore, certain concessions have been granted. For example, in the railways, senior citizens received a 30 percent ticket discount. Postal services also offered

various discounts for the dissemination of knowledge, such as registered book post and ordinary book post, which have now been discontinued. Perhaps an attempt is being made to commercialize the postal department. While some sectors deserve concessions, it seems that the postal department, like the corporate sector, is now engaged in a race to make money. While Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia was expected to be generous and

ensure the postal department's commitment to public welfare, he has become a melon. And the postal department has begun to show its true colors. One night, the post office in my village, Rajpur, disappeared. It was surprising that during the era of a government that promised development, a facility vanished without a sound, leaving post office customers bewildered. After a ten-year struggle, the Rajpur branch post office was upgraded to a sub-post

office, which was inaugurated by former Union Minister Shanta Kumar on March 25, 2018. The people of Rajpur and its surrounding areas welcomed it, and thousands of accounts were opened. However, in the past seven years, senior post office officials have never held a meeting with post office beneficiaries. In fact, with a few exceptions, none of the in-charges appointed here have shown any resolve. The majority of the population in Rajpur is

senior and super-senior, elderly women and men. You are taking away this privilege without warning, without notice. The villagers' anger is justified, and that is why they have decided to boycott the protest and operate their accounts from Rajpur.

A letter of protest has been submitted to Dr. Rajiv Bhardwaj, Lok Sabha MP from Kangra-Chamba, Mr. Shanta Kumar, and other concerned individuals. In fact, the department's uni-

lateral decision to link Rajpur residents to the Agricultural University Post Office is invalid, impractical, and a dictatorial decree. These accounts were opened in Rajpur and were intended for the Rajpur Post Office.

The department's intransigence seems strange. This unilateral, dictatorial action is not only unfair and unjust, but also a despicable step against the people as India embarks on the path to development.

BJP's 'Nabin' era

Nitin Nabin has been elected the new National President of the BJP. He began his tenure with a grand ceremony in the presence of Prime Minister Modi. A total of 37 nominations were submitted in favor of Nabin by Union Ministers, State Presidents, and the Parliamentary Board, and there were no nominations against him. Therefore, he was elected unopposed. It is an established tradition within the BJP that the top leadership finalizes a name, and the entire organization approves it. There has never been any opposition or challenge to the selection of a National President in the BJP, so the "Nabin era" has now begun within the party. This should be acknowledged. At 45, the new National President is the youngest leader. Before him, Amit Shah was 49 and Nitin Gadkari was 52 when they became BJP President. News has also emerged from within the party that 70 percent of the positions in the BJP organization will now be given to those under the age of 60. It is clear that major changes are imminent at the level of the National Executive and office bearers. Since the Nitin Nabin era, the BJP has begun promoting the idea that 65 percent of the country's population is young and that the BJP is the preferred party of "Gen G." The party's primary concerns, goals, priorities, and programs will also be "Gen G"-centric. This thinking and strategy are also driven by the mandate data. In the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, over 39 percent of young people voted for the BJP-NDA. This support figure has even reached 45-47 percent in state-level elections.

Mask of Peace, Strategy of Power: Trump's Global Paradox

The personality and working style of US President Donald Trump, who is passionately seeking the Nobel Peace Prize, have emerged as a profound irony and paradox for global politics. As appealing as his claim to be a messenger of peace appears, the reality of his actions is equally contradictory. While he seeks credit for establishing peace in various parts of the world, his decisions, statements, and policies often seem to breed war, unrest, fear, and instability.

What kind of peace is this, accompanied by the echo of bombs, the brunt of sanctions, and the language of hatred? What kind of a charade of peace is this, in which humanity's blood continues to flow while the regime pursues its own interests? Trump's proposed plan for peace in Gaza is a recent example of this paradox. It is presented more as a business deal than as peace, as if the future of a people who have been struggling with violence, displacement, and identity crises for decades can be decided by a real estate or economic package. This attempt to impose peace, bypassing international law, the role of the United Nations, the consent of local populations, and accountability, reveals that in Trump's view, peace is not a moral or humanitarian value, but a tool for power and political gain. Thus, the claim of peace under the shadow of bombs is merely a charade, revealing a bargain for peace and a hunger for power. Trump's so-called peace plan is merely a politics of domination in the name of peace. It appears that the words are nonviolent, but the actions are vio-

lent. Trump has consistently disparaged the United Nations, calling it incompetent, biased, and bureaucratic, while the truth is that the multilateral institutional framework is essential for global peace and stability. When powerful countries find this framework unsuitable, they begin to undermine it—Trump is the vocal embodiment of this trend. The idea of ??a new global peace institution proposed by Donald Trump is as attractive as it is entangled in contradictions. In the name of peacebuilding, the attempt to establish an international institution that bypasses accepted multilateral structures like the United Nations reveals a desire for power-centric dominance rather than peace. It's natural to question how a

leadership whose policies are based on the production and sale of weapons, the expansion of military alliances, the threat of war, and the pressure on the world through economic punishment can suddenly become the new purveyor of peace. In Trump's political thinking, peace appears not to be a humanitarian commitment, but a means of bargaining, control, and profit. Therefore, the utility of his proposed peace institution is seriously questioned. Any institution established without legitimacy, accountability, and global consensus cannot be a vehicle for peace; it merely serves as a tool for imposing the will of powerful nations. In this context, Trump's efforts do not appear to be a concrete initiative towards peace, but rather another conspiracy and



evil attempt to cover up violence-oriented policies and strengthen his hold on the global governance system.

In Trump's view, peace does not mean resolving conflicts, but rather turning them in his favor. Sometimes he talks about establishing such a so-called peace mechanism parallel to the United Nations, and sometimes he threatens war on Iran. On the one hand, he praises European countries and attempts to establish his influence, while on the other, he pressures those same countries with trade sanctions and military spending. This double standard and discrepancy between words and actions exacerbates global instability. While speaking the language of peace, arms sales, the expansion of military alliances, and economic penalties have all been integral to his policies. As a result, the world stands at a juncture where the signs of war are growing louder, and humanity appears to be on the brink of extinction. In the context of the Gaza crisis, it becomes even clearer that peace imposed without legitimacy, consent, and accountability is never lasting.

Implications of US control over Venezuela

As for the US's vulture-like gaze on Venezuela's natural oil resources, that's also true. However, if Maduro had made serious efforts to interdict drugs from reaching the US and had acted on US advice to punish international drug traffickers, he and his wife would certainly not have been kidnapped, and Venezuela's oil resources would have been under his control. The global media is not interested in this.. These policies, to some extent, are the same as those taught to the people by the plunderers who came to plunder this country. The adverse effect of this is that the people here live by a Hindu philosophy in their imagination and a variety of imported, non-Indian philosophies in their practice. Whether domestically or internationally, it's impossible to truly identify who is on whose side or against whom. No one seems to grasp the underlying problem at the root of every incident. The abduction of the Venezuelan president would, in a common sense, make the kidnapper consider the American president a criminal. However, if the Venezuelan incident is considered in light of the growing number of zombies in America, both America and Trump will appear justified. Just as the proliferation of drugs and drugs in India is destroying the lives of the youth, in a similar way, the drugs transported to and from Venezuela are turning scores of American youth into zombies, destroying their own lives. It's common to see young men, deeply intoxicated and unconscious, lying in abandoned American streets, lying there for days and months. Numerous awareness programs are

being run to wean them off drugs. De-addiction centers are being established for them. Rehabilitation programs are also being implemented. Vast sums of money are being spent on all these American programs aimed at de-addiction. Despite all this, the US remains plagued by the drug menace. Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores, were not captured by US Delta Force soldiers in the early morning hours of January 3, 2026. The US had taken several harsh actions and issued warnings before capturing Nicolás Maduro. In March 2020, the US officially charged Maduro with narco-terrorism, i.e., drug-induced terrorism. A \$15 million bounty was placed on him for this, which was increased to \$50 million in 2025. In August 2025, the Trump administration issued a secret directive warning of using military force against cartels. Subsequently, in September 2025, the US attacked boats used for smuggling off the Venezuelan coast. Thus, after years of diplomatic and economic sanctions,

which had been imposed with modifications since 2017, in early January 2026, US Special Forces finally arrested Maduro in a covert operation and presented him in federal court in New York, where he faces charges of narcoterrorism and arms trafficking. The indictment presented to the court clearly states that, according to US estimates in March 2020, 200 to 250 metric tons of cocaine were smuggled through Venezuela annually. In 2024, Venezuela earned a total revenue of \$8.2 billion from 24 percent of the cocaine shipped to the US. A 2019 CNN report stated that the 240 tons of cocaine shipped from Venezuela are worth approximately \$40 billion to the US. Thousands of American youth are becoming addicted to these drugs every year. Although the rulers before Trump made the issue of young generation becoming zombies a social issue and many films were also made in America showing the horrors of zombie life, but no one had shown the courage to attack the basic mechanism of youth becoming zombies. Hurt by this, Trump made a

list of 'Major Drug Transit and Illicit Drug Producing Countries', that is, the major narcotic or illegal drug producing countries, which almost matched the 'World Drug Report 2025' of the United Nations UNODC.

According to this, the most crisis-prone drug trafficking and producing countries of the world are Afghanistan, Myanmar, Colombia, Peru and Bolivia. The major transit countries for smuggled drugs include Mexico, India, China, Pakistan, and Ecuador. The US President, in September 2025, identified a total of 23 countries as major drug transit or production hubs in the 2026 fiscal year list. Among these, countries in Central America and the Caribbean include the Bahamas, Belize, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Nicaragua, and Panama. Countries like Venezuela and Ecuador in South America, and Laos and Thailand in Asia, are also involved in trafficking.



Banking sector outlook remains positive, earnings to grow approx. 16% CAGR over FY26-28: Motilal Oswal

New Delhi, Agency: The outlook for the banking sector remains positive, with earnings expected to recover steadily over the medium term, supported by stable margins, improving asset quality, and a pickup in loan growth, according to a report by Motilal Oswal Financial Services.

The report estimates that the banking sector will deliver an earnings CAGR of around 16 per cent over FY26-28E, signalling a gradual but sustained recovery after a period of pressure.

It stated, "Sector outlook positive; Estimate earnings CAGR of approx. 16 per cent



over FY27-28E. Buoyed by resilient margin performance and improved asset quality, we have earlier raised our aggregate FY26/27 earnings estimates by approx. 3 per cent/1 per cent in 2QFY26 results, mainly led by PSU banks".

The report added that resilient margin performance and improved asset quality have supported earnings, prompting it to earlier raise

its aggregate FY26 and FY27 earnings estimates by around 3 per cent and 1 per cent, respectively, after the 2QFY26 results, mainly led by public sector banks.

These estimates have been maintained in the 3QFY26 preview as well.

According to the report, private banks are expected to see stronger growth, with aggregate earnings projected to grow by 21 per cent over FY27-28. The recovery in earnings momentum, along with better loan growth aided by factors such as GST implementation, direct tax rate cuts, and lower borrowing costs, is expected to support a recovery in earnings growth in the coming quarter.

improved sector performance over the medium term.

It noted that BFSI earnings estimates were consistently downgraded in recent quarters due to margin pressure, weak loan growth, and elevated credit costs. However, the pace of earnings downgrades has slowed significantly in recent months, indicating that the worst may be behind for the sector.

The report highlighted that margins are now stabilising, stress in unsecured asset quality is easing and loan growth is gaining traction. These factors are expected to support a recovery in earnings growth in the coming quarter.

It expects the banking sector's earnings cycle to undergo a calibrated "U-shaped" recovery. After a largely flat FY26, the report estimates earnings growth of around 8 per cent year-on-year in FY26E, followed by a stronger recovery in FY27. Overall, earnings are projected to grow at a CAGR of about 16 per cent over FY27-28E, broadly in line with the consensus estimate of around 15 per cent. The report added that the improvement in earnings momentum, combined with better loan growth conditions, should help drive improved sectoral performance in FY27.

Shubman couldn't utilize his players effectively: Ashwin

Former Indian spinner R Ashwin has questioned the leadership abilities of Indian Test and ODI captain Shubman Gill. According to Ashwin, there was a lack of management in the middle overs during the ODI series against New Zealand. Ashwin believes the bowlers were not rotated properly. Especially in the second and third ODIs, the resources were not utilized effectively in the middle overs, which allowed the matches to slip away from the Indian team. According to Ashwin, when the match was on the line, Shubman failed to utilize his best players effectively. Ashwin also questioned the way spinner Kuldeep Yadav was used against Daryl Mitchell and Glenn Phillips. Ashwin said, "MS Dhoni and Rohit Sharma's captaincy is praised so much because they know where and when to use their resources

and against which batsman. This was somewhat lacking in this series." Ashwin suggested that Shubman's decisions seemed influenced by the failures of previous matches, which led to a lack of confidence in his bowlers in the crucial third match, whereas a

bowler should not be judged based on the previous match's performance. Ashwin said that Shubman didn't have a Plan B when one approach failed. He said, "If you utilize your resources properly and still fail, that's fine, but at least try to use them correctly first."

The difference between IPL and PSL comes to light

The total team salary is even less than the salaries of Rishabh and Shreyas combined.

The significant difference between India's Indian Premier League (IPL) and Pakistan's Super League (PSL) has once again become apparent. The PSL has increased player salaries ahead of the 2026 season. Even after this increase, the players' earnings are still less than those of Indian team players Rishabh Pant and Shreyas Iyer, who play in the IPL. The PCB has stated that the salary cap has been increased from \$1.3 million (approximately 11.3 crore) to \$1.6 million (approximately 14.5 crore) per team. This is

the amount that each of the eight teams can spend in the auction. In total, this amount will be \$12.8 million (approximately 116.48 crore) for all eight teams. Even after the PSL salary increase, the difference in earnings between players in the PSL and IPL is evident. The two highest-earning players in the IPL 2025 season, Rishabh Pant and Shreyas Iyer (27 crore and 26.75 crore respectively), have earned more than the entire salary budget of a single PSL team. Even MS Dhoni received approximately 6 crore in the first IPL auction in 2008, which is equivalent to the amount spent on the entire squad of a PSL team. The earnings of the teams in the first IPL season were approximately 20 crore, which is more than the earnings of the 11th season of the PSL.

Lizelle Lee fined 10 percent of match fee and given one demerit point for breaching Code of Conduct

Delhi Capitals player Lizelle Lee has been sanctioned for breaching the Code of Conduct in the Women's Premier League (WPL). Lee was fined 10 percent of her match fee and given one demerit point for an incident that occurred during the match against Mumbai Indians at the BCA Stadium in Vadodara. The incident took place in the 11th over of the Delhi Capitals' innings when Lizelle Lee was given out stumped off the bowling of Amanjot Kaur. The ball was on the leg side, and Lee lost her balance while attempting a flick shot. Wicketkeeper Rahila Firdous quickly completed the stumping. The on-field umpires then referred

the decision to the third umpire, who reviewed the incident from various angles, including the stump camera. After reviewing the replays, the third umpire ruled that Lee's bat was in the air when the bails were dislodged, and she was given out. At that time, Lee was batting brilliantly, having scored 46 runs off 28 balls. After being given out, Lizelle Lee appeared visibly upset with the decision. She expressed her displeasure while walking off the field and continued to show her frustration even after the decision.

RCB and Royals to name home ground by January 27: BCCI

The issue of home grounds for Rajasthan Royals and Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) for the 2026 IPL season remains unresolved. The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has given both teams until January 27 to decide whether they want to play their home matches at their designated home grounds or at an alternative venue. It is unlikely that either team will be able to play at their traditional home grounds. The Royals may not be able to play in Jaipur because the Rajasthan Cricket Association (RCA) elections have not yet been held. Meanwhile, several people died in a stampede at the M.

Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru during celebrations after the IPL 2025 victory. Given this incident, it is unlikely that the IPL organizers will allow RCB to play there. In this scenario, the Royals might play their home matches in Pune, while RCB could host five home matches at the DY Patil Stadium and two in Raipur. For matches in Navi Mumbai, RCB would need permission from Mumbai Indians, as IPL rules stipulate that two teams cannot host matches in the same city. RCB owners are also hesitant to push for the Bengaluru ground because, under new regulations, they would be held responsible if any incident occurs. The IPL 2026 season is scheduled to begin on March 26, with the final match on May 31.

Australian Open 2026: Alcaraz overcomes Hanfmann's challenge to reach the third round



Melbourne: Spanish tennis star Carlos Alcaraz advanced to the third round of the Australian Open 2026 after defeating Germany's Yannick Hanfmann in a tough match, 7-6(4), 6-3, 6-2. With this victory, Alcaraz took another strong step towards achieving a career Grand Slam.
